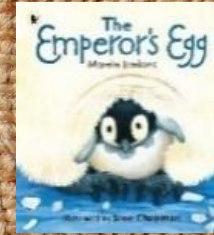


EYFS Curriculum Information

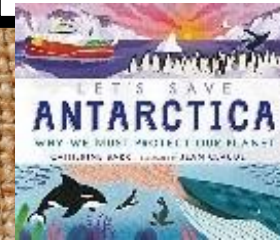
Spring 1 - Frozen Planet

Our topic in Spring 1 will be based upon Winter, cold places around the world and animals which live in cold places as well as significant people and events in the calendar.

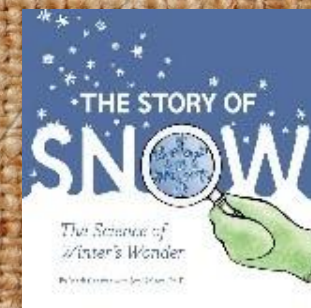
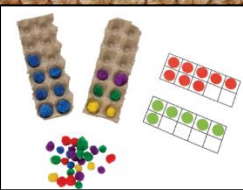
Throughout this topic, the children will be learning about teamwork, sharing and responsibilities they can start to develop. We will be exploring all things Winter, including a famous person called Ernest Shackleton. We will be looking at Antarctica and the Antarctic and some of the animals which live here. We will also be taking part in celebrating Chinese New Year and Shrove Tuesday!



We will continue to have focus stories each week and will be helping the children to develop re-telling by remembering the beginning, middle and end to a story. Children will be encouraged to use and understand new vocabulary during discussions.



In our Maths sessions we will be recapping the numbers 0-5 including 1 more and 1 less, exploring mass and capacity, learning about 6, 7 and 8 as well as odd and even numbers and doubles and possibly begin adding and look at length and height!
