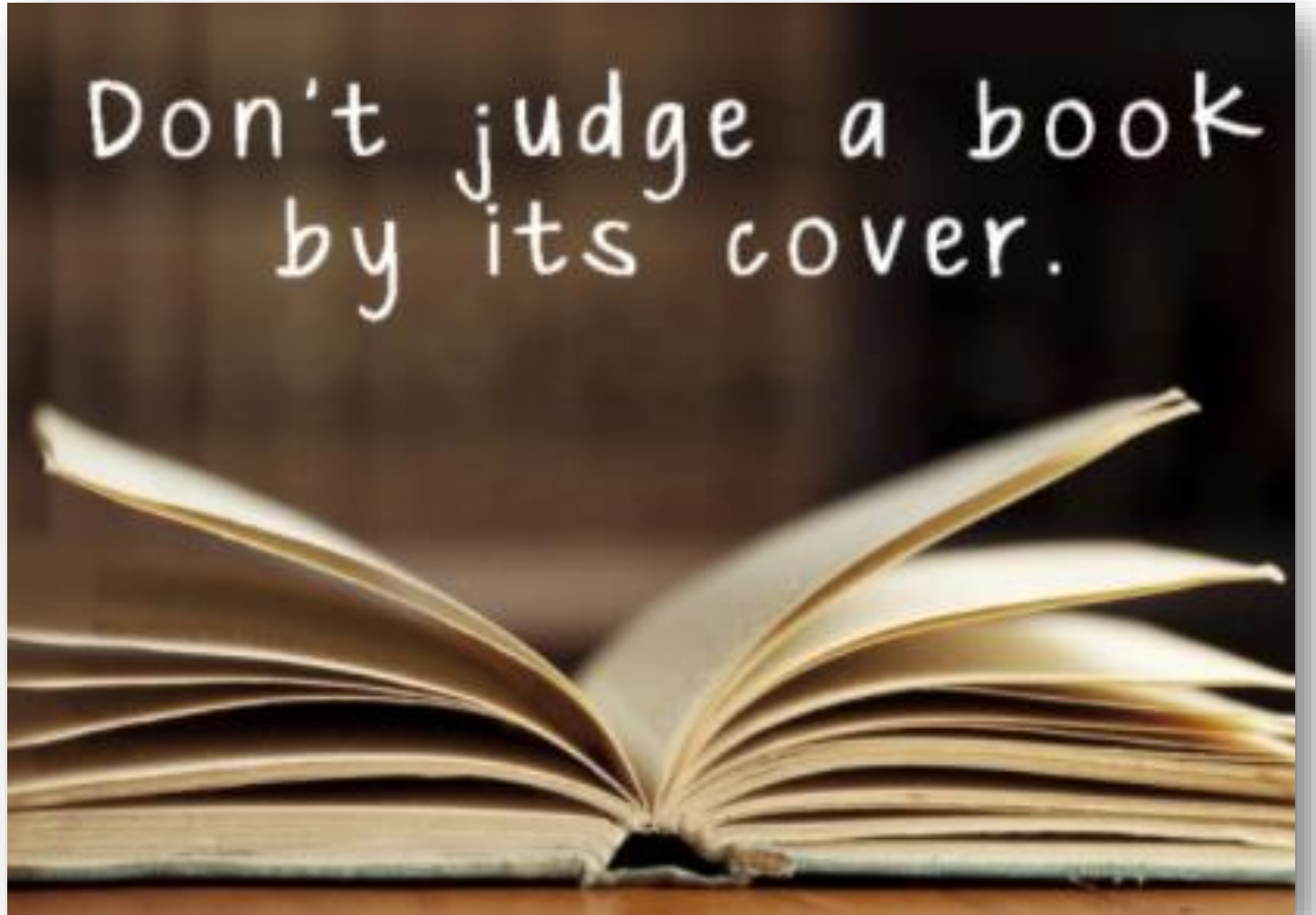

Have you ever chosen a book which appeared boring but when you started to read it, you couldn't put down?

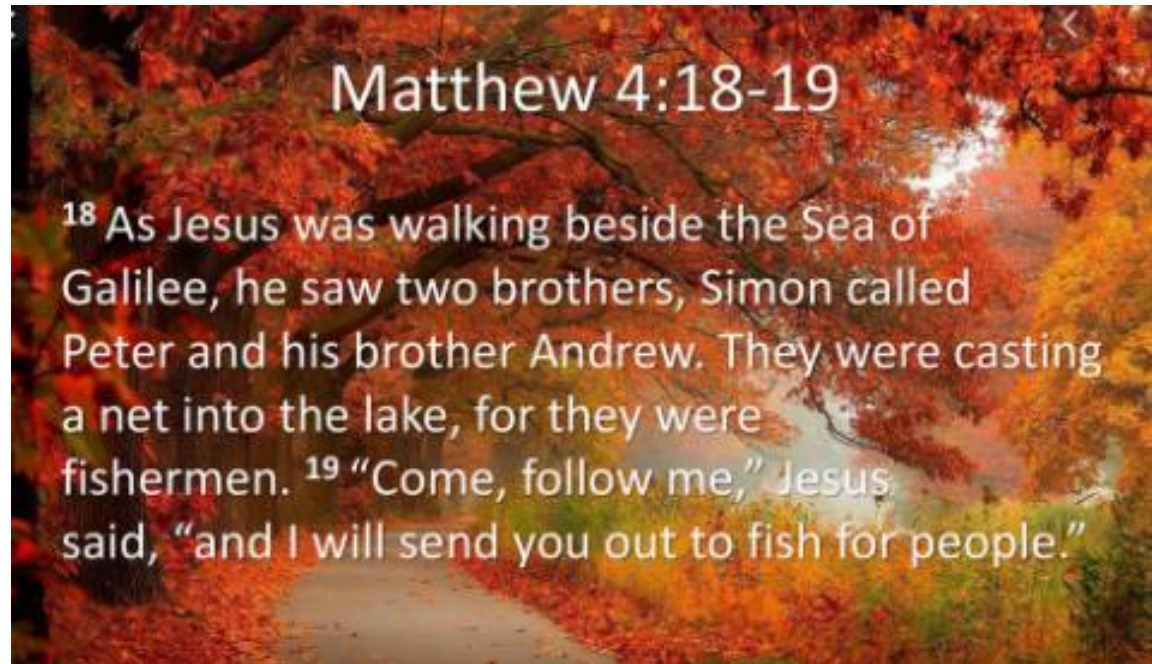


